
Transition



The South Wales Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ACHD) Service.



Adult Congenital Heart Disease is a success story. It is estimated between five and nine of every 1,000 pregnancies results in Congenital Heart Disease (CHD). Ever more people born with CHD are surviving well into adulthood.

While the number of adults with CHD is known to be increasing there is no reliable estimate of the number of people living with CHD. In the future we are likely to see the service moving from one that is focussed on children, to one that is treating a growing number of young people and adults, often with complex health needs.

The consequent need to expand the Welsh ACHD service to treat people in a more timely manner and closer to their homes has been recognised.

The care and management of ACHD patients is a truly multifaceted approach covering multiple disciplines and spans a lifetime Our ACHD team consists of Specialists who work together to provide holisticcare for adults (aged 16 years and over) across Wales. .


